| A Service Project        | A community service project organized by the service team in which all troops in the service unit participate. This large scale project allows troops of girls to work together on projects benefiting their own community.  |
| B Girl Scout Week        | A celebratory event organized by the service team and attended by all troops in the service unit. It takes place during the week of March 12th, the anniversary of the first Girl Scout meeting in Savannah, Georgia.  |
| C Issues for Girls       | An educational and informative event in which all troops in the service unit participate. The event focus is on issues of particular importance for today's girls and young women. For example, drug awareness, growing up female, science and math, etc.              |
| D Badge/Patch Workshop   | A badge or patch workshop organized by the service team for all troops or a specific age-level of troops and delivered in the service unit to girls residing in the service unit.  |
| E Bridging               | A service team organized awards ceremony and/or bridging event open to all troops. It is designed to emphasize the continuity of program between age levels and is usually attended by friends and relatives.  |
| F Thinking Day           | A service unit organized celebration on or near February 22nd, the birthday of both Lord and Lady Baden-Powell. On this day, especially, Girl Scouts and Girl Guides around the world think of one another and wish happiness and success to their sisters everywhere. |
| G Juliette's Birthday    | A service unit organized event for all troops celebrating the birthday anniversary of Juliette Gordon Low, the founder of Girl Scouting, born October 31, 1860,  |
| H Multiple Service Units | A gathering of one or more service units. <b>Each service unit that attends</b> will need to submit a report form.   |
